Our History

TiE was founded in Silicon Valley in December 1992 by Ambrish Patel (also known as AJ) and eight cofounders. AJ was a visionary leader passionate about creating an organization dedicated to networking and fostering entrepreneurship via mentoring. AJ started TiE under his name as a DBA, leveraging his company's resources and facilities for over a year to host monthly networking events and engage more entrepreneurs and executives. These early efforts demonstrated receptivity and validated the need for an organization like TiE.

In late 1993, TiE appointed its first official President to formalize the organization, and by 1994, it was incorporated with an elected Board and Charter Members-successful entrepreneurs committed to mentoring and supporting aspiring business owners. Twenty veteran entrepreneurs signed up as Charter Members at the time of incorporation.

Initially, TiE-Silicon Valley served as the parent entity for other chapters. In 2002, on Prof. CK Prahalad's recommendation, TiE Global was formed to unify all chapters under one umbrella, with TiE Silicon Valley becoming one of the global chapters.

Entrepreneurship is good for the world as it drives innovations that solve for our biggest challenges. It is an instrumental force driving Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and TiE is proud to stand committed to be at the forefront of this mission. By nurturing innovation, driving inclusive growth, and promoting ethical entrepreneurship, TiE is uniquely positioned to drive transformative change.

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TiE Young Entrepreneurs (TYE)



TiE Young Entrepreneurs is a global youth mentorship program conducted in over 30 TiE chapters across North America, Asia, and North UK.

The TYE Program transcends conventional learning, reaching out to those eager to forge a unique path in startups, corporations, or the public sector. By weaving students into a global community of mentors and like-minded visionaries, we are building a collaborative network of creativity and ambition. This program aligns closely with the UN's SDG 4, which focuses on ensuring inclusive and equitable quality education and promoting lifelong learning opportunities for all. Key features of the program include the following:

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Mentorship: Experienced entrepreneurs and business leaders from the TiE network provide mentorship to students. Mentors offer guidance, share their experiences, and provide valuable insights, helping students refine their business ideas and strategies.



Workshops and Seminars: TYE includes interactive workshops and seminars led by industry experts. These sessions cover various topics, including market research, product development, financial planning, and pitching to investors, providing students with practical knowledge and skills.



Business Plan Competition: A highlight of the TYE program is the business plan competition, where students form teams to develop and pitch their business ideas. This competition fosters teamwork, creativity, and critical thinking, allowing students to apply learnings in a real-world context.



Global Exposure: TYE offers students the opportunity to interact with peers from different cultures and backgrounds through global connections. This exposure broadens their perspectives and helps them understand global business dynamics.



Life Skills Development: Beyond business skills, TYE focuses on developing invaluable life skills such as leadership, communication, problem-solving, and resilience.



About the TYE Program



The TYE program, aimed at high school students (grades 9-12), to be completed over a school year, fosters entrepreneurship through a structured curriculum that covers various aspects of business and leadership. This initiative helps students develop critical thinking, problem-solving skills, and practical knowledge about starting and running a business. The program includes classroom sessions, mentorship from experienced professionals, and business plan competitions at local and global levels for a cash prize. The genesis of the TYE Global Program stemmed from the recognition that the next generation of entrepreneurs and business leaders will emerge from today's youth. TYE harnesses the five pillars of TiE to empower high school students with entrepreneurial skills, fostering invention and innovation through hands-on experience rather than mere discussion. This 12-week program is carefully designed to cultivate self-confidence, leadership, creativity, and presentation skills among students.



Driving sustainable programs at TiE is not just a commitment, it's a journey towards achieving a greater good. Aligning with the UN Sustainable Development Goals, we join a global movement of responsibility, striving for a future where social and environmental well-being are the cornerstones of progress. From learning essential entrepreneurial skills to hands-on experience, the TYE program supports the broader objectives of SDG 4 by ensuring that youth receive the education and skills needed to thrive in the future.

TYE Program Structure



Applications Open	Each TiE chapter advertises the program to schools and educational institutions. Interested students would then apply, and a selection process would be conducted to choose participants based on criteria such as motivation, creativity, and potential for entrepreneurship.
Orientation	Selected participants would attend an orientation session where they would be introduced to the program, its objectives, and the expectations from them as participants.
Curriculum	The TYE program typically consists of a structured curriculum covering various aspects of entrepreneurship, including ideation, market research, business planning, finance, marketing, and presentation skills. Each session is led by experienced entrepreneurs, industry experts, or educators.
Workshops and Sessions	Throughout the program, participants would attend workshops, seminars, and interactive sessions where they learn about different aspects of entrepreneurship. These sessions include hands-on activities, group discussions, case studies, and guest lectures.
Mentoring	Participants are then paired with mentors who are experienced entrepreneurs or professionals in relevant industries. Mentors would provide guidance, feedback and support to help participants develop their business ideas and navigate challenges.
Networking Events	The TiE Chapters would organize networking events where participants can connect with fellow participants, mentors, and other members of the entrepreneurial community. These events provide valuable networking opportunities and exposure to real-world entrepreneurial environments.
Pitching Competition	The program then culminates in a pitching competition where participants present their business ideas or projects to a panel of judges, typically comprising investors, entrepreneurs, and industry experts.
Graduation and Follow-up	At the end of the program, participants graduate and receive certificates, recognizing their completion. Cash and kind awards are presented to global winners. Chapters may also provide ongoing support to help participants further develop their entrepreneurial aspirations beyond the program.

TYE Chapter Highlights - India



TiE Bangalore has seen over 300 participants of the TYE program from 2018 onwards. In 2023, they boasted three full cohorts, wherein 15 teams of 63 students were offered mentoring, with a total participant count of 65, a total speaker count of 24 from three cohorts and 13 mentors from three cohorts. This resulted in one runner up, and one winner at both the chapter and global levels.



TiE Delhi-NCR has been nurturing young minds to become entrepreneurs since 2010. The chapter has successfully completed 13 editions of TYE. A successful 3-step format is followed by the chapter and includes.



In 2023, **TiE Kerala** reached **over 5,000 students** through the TYE program. At the session, startup founders and seasoned entrepreneurs share their experiences and insights to inspire the students, followed by the TYE workshop. TiE selects the best ideas and assigns them a dedicated mentor to support them all the way to finals.



TiE Kolkata launched the TYE program with robust promotion through social media and internal networks of charter members to attract participants. As part of the program, the chapter conducted an intensive workshop to provide foundational knowledge and inspire innovative thinking among participants.

In 2023, **TiE Vizag** marked its inaugural participation in the TYE program, launching with 27 students. Mentors guided six teams, helping them develop and refine their innovative solutions. The winning and runner-up teams were thoroughly prepared to represent the chapter at the TYE Global competition in Hyderabad.





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TYE Winners at a Glance

TiE Oregon | POTE

ss Model

POTE, a female-led team, won local Chapter Finals and was selected to represent Oregon at the TYE Global Competition held in San Diego in June 2023. POTE upcycles discarded puffer coats and extra material to make tote bags. 22 teams participated in the competition. POTE made it through the semifinal round to the finals with 8 other teams. They also won an award for the Best Business Model.

TiE Bangalore | Seature

Seature, a project that transforms car seats and other spare parts into furniture, showcases innovative upcycling of scrap materials. The initiative won the TiE Elevator Pitch competition and secured seed funding from Soundarya Central School. One use case was that they turned old car seats into stylish and comfortable chairs, blending creativity with sustainability.



TiE Kerala | ECHOSIGN

ECHOSIGN, which integrates motion sensors and AI technology to bridge the communication gap by translating sign language gestures into spoken words in real-time, has demonstrated great potential and ingenuity. It is indeed an inspiring solution that addresses a significant challenge in our society.



TiE Carolinas | Drug Detectives

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The local winner from TiE Carolinas for the 2022-2023 competition, the 'Drug Detectives' team, achieved global victory that year. They tackled the issue of drink spiking (e.g., at bars) by developing a strip, similar to a pH strip, capable of detecting the drugs most used for spiking. The team received widespread acclaim from local media and is still exploring deployment options.



TYE Success Stories



TiE Rajasthan's TYE program has been a beacon of entrepreneurial education since its launch in 2014. The program has seen remarkable growth, receiving 680 applications this year alone, a testament to its impact and appeal. Notably, 115 teams were formed, representing 60 schools. TYE Rajasthan's social media presence has amplified its reach and influence. A robust alumni network of 350 actively connected individuals showcases the program's lasting impact, with 23% of alumni venturing into startups post-TYE. Their success is underscored by a 73% rate of participants founding their own companies. As they gear up for TYE 2025 and potential participation in TYE Global, TiE Rajasthan's TYE program stands as a model of impactful entrepreneurial education.



TiE Atlanta provided mentorship from experienced entrepreneurs and industry leaders, enabling the startup, HighTouch, to navigate the challenges of scaling a business. Resources such as workshops, seminars, and access to cutting-edge tools were provided to HighTouch to enhance its technological capabilities and expand its market reach. By connecting HighTouch with venture capitalists and funding opportunities, TiE played a crucial role in securing the \$90M in funding that has propelled the

company forward. HighTouch has since raised further funding and is a market leader in reverse ETL, providing the most destinations, and deepest integrations, and serves both technical and nontechnical users. Enterprises like Warner Music Group, Flickr, and Plaid use HighTouch to accelerate market growth, improve ad spend, reduce customer churn, and supercharge operational efficiency.





The TYE Program at TiE Delhi-NCR has seen participants from 500+ schools across India & overseas. After securing the top spot at the regional finals held at the Delhi chapter, Team DetectoClip, scooped three awards including the 2nd runners up overall, Makers Faire award, and Best Customer Validation award. The winning team comprised nine high schoolers from across India and their venture - DetectoClip is a device for the visually impaired. The program empowered team members to learn key leadership skills, and to adopt the entrepreneurial mindset – an important asset in today's world.





FOSTERING ENTREPRENEURSHIP



TiE U

Between 2000 and 2010, the surge in technology startups motivated many university graduates to pursue entrepreneurial ventures and launch their own businesses. However, even before the COVID-19 crisis, the global startup rate had been on a downward trend. Despite strong entrepreneurial aspirations among graduates, the actual startup rate remains low.

The TiE U Program acts as a catalyst to launch many student startups globally. The program aims to enhance college learning through mentorship from real life entrepreneurs, internships, local and global networking and access to funding sources.

TiE U Activities & Programs



TiE U addresses the primary obstacles faced by university graduates wishing to pursue entrepreneurship, offering a robust ecosystem that supports startups led by students and recent grads. The program provides training in fundamental business concepts that resonate with the ambitions, ideas, talents, and market prospects of university students and graduates, facilitating the development of feasible enterprises. Moreover, it cultivates an entrepreneurial ecosystem through an array of events and engagements that bring together startups, TiE members, TiE alumni external mentors, industry experts, coaches, and resource partners. This is maintained through several programs, events, activities, communities, and platforms which vary on a Chapter-to-Chapter basis.

TiE U Program Structure



The entrepreneurship skills development phase begins with the formation of work groups. Faculty members assist registered students in forming teams to develop their business ideas into comprehensive business plans. To maintain a high standard of applications, an intra-college pitch event is organized, resulting in the selection of the most promising teams. These finalists gain entry to a series of workshops and boot camp sessions tailored to enhance their competition readiness by assisting business plan development and preparation to showcase their ideas/concepts to investor networks. These skill development sessions are facilitated by TiE Associate members, seasoned entrepreneurs with 5 to 15 years of industry experience, ensuring that participants receive real-world insights and guidance. The program culminates in the Inter-College Competition (Grand Finale), where the top two teams from different colleges compete. A specialized jury evaluates the presentations and selects the winners. This competition showcases entrepreneurial activity at the state level and offers opportunities for financial and mentorship support, and further startup ecosystem opportunities.

The TiE U Nurture program was initiated post the pitch competition by documenting and implementing a plan that applied the key concepts and elements to increase the startups' investor readiness. . This was executed at 6 TiE chapters in both the United States (Atlanta, Houston, and Oregon) and India (Coimbatore, Mysuru, and Pune).

The primary objective of helping the participating startups to be more investorready was pursued through organized mentoring, knowledge sessions/workshops, data gathering and assessment tools, and multiple rounds with judges acting as investors. Further, each startup was provided with two or more mentors along with expert advisors on various aspects of their startup journey to make them investable. Online tools such as for logging mentor sessions and investment assessments were utilized on an ongoing/periodic basis to measure progress.

The outcome of the "TiE U Nurture" pilot project (aka Project Neptune) was that 6 out of the 19 startups that began the program successfully completed the entire 18week/130-day duration from Aug.-Dec. 2023. The primary objective of helping the participating startups to be more investor-ready was pursued through organized mentoring, knowledge sessions/workshops, data gathering and assessment tools, and multiple rounds with judges acting as investors.
